Pastel Remix

For this project I used:

6 fat quarters


½ yard for backing

¼ yard for binding

Warm and Natural batting



Here is my cute bundle of fat quarters of Remix I used in this project.



I drew out my design to use for my pattern. To begin with, I selected my fabrics for the center four patch.



I cut 6 1/2 inch squares from dot pieces for the center four patch. I used the multi-dot twice.





From the fabrics pictured above, I cut a 2 ½ and a 3 ½ strip from each.



Then I cut the strips in half for more possible block combinations.



In this picture, you can see how I randomized the strips.



Sew the 3 ½ inch strips into pairs as shown in the above picture. Then cut the sets into 6 ½ inch blocks.



Sew three 2 ½ inch strips together as shown in the above picture. Then cut the strip sets into 6 ½ inch blocks.




Next I placed my blocks on my design wall. I added a 3 ½ inch strip of the chevron print.



Sew blocks together into pairs and then sew the pairs into the runner.



Next I drew out my flower shape on Steam-a-Seam Lite.



To avoid the center of the flower being too stiff, I donut the center like shown in the picture above.



I then ironed my shapes onto the flower fabric.



After cutting the flowers out, I ironed them onto the runner. I did a simple zigzag around the edge, but left it raw. You will notice that my top, batting and back are sandwiched together ready to begin quilting.



I decided to quilt the flowers first.



Next I did echo quilting in the center area, highlighting the flowers.



Deciding to put a center in each of the flowers, I drew a circle around the base of a thread spool. I used the Steam-a-Seam Lite again.



I ironed the circles on and then stitched around the circle.



This picture gives you an idea of the different quilting I did on this runner. It was lots of fun!



Here is another view of the quilting.



The runner is all trimmed and ready to sew binding on.



Here is my binding fabric.



I used three 2 ½ inch strips for the binding. This picture above shows the binding on and ready for handwork. Unfortunately, I shipped this runner before taking one last completed picture, sorry.

I hope that you have enjoyed this tutorial and this adorable project. The finished project measures about 12 x 42.
